This school year, we will continue using **SchoolMessenger** for all school wide communications. Most of you have already received communications through the SchoolMessenger system. This system allows us to send communications via voicemail, email and phone texts. To ensure that you receive school wide and classroom notifications, it is crucial that any changes to your primary phone number and email are communicated promptly to the school main office. - <u>Contact Verification:</u> During the Welcome Back to School Events you will receive the contact verification form. This form MUST be completed and returned to your child's homeroom teacher the same day or by the first day of school, August 28, 2023.
- <u>Communication</u>: School wide communications will be sent via SchoolMessenger. These messages are sent by email, text, and voicemail when necessary. Opt in to receive these important messages and/or download the app for easy access, click here for instructions.
- <u>Transportation to/from school:</u> Please complete the transportation survey, click <u>HERE</u>. Please note, if you do not complete and submit the transportation survey by Tuesday, August 1, 2023, your child will be assigned as a car rider and no school bus option will be available to you.
- New breakfast procedure in place for school year 2023-2024: Breakfast will be available to all students from 6:45am 7:10am (grades 6-8) and 8:10am 8:25am (grades K-5). Breakfast will not be available after 7:10 am (grades 6-8) or 8:25 am (grades K-5). The only exception to this procedure would be to accommodate late bus arrivals.

- Changes to the Uniform Policy: **NEW for the 2023-2024 School Year:**
 - Students can wear only sneakers/athletic shoes that are any color and must be non-marking.
 Footwear should be secured on the foot (ex. laces tied, Velcro fastened).
 - No Crocs, sandals, slides, slippers, cleats, Heelys (shoes with wheels), etc. are permitted for regular school wear.
- <u>Dollar Dress Down Days</u>: We will have bi-weekly *Dollar Dress Down Days (DDD)* scheduled in our School Calendar throughout the 2023-2024 school year. Students will follow the DDD guidelines and expectations shared in the School Code of Conduct. Families can send cash payments with their students or use the electronic payment option on our school website. Selecting the electronic payment option will allow for daily, monthly, or annual payments based on your preference and convenience. DDD earnings are designated to enhance and support academic, extracurricular, and other student-related activities. Click here to make Dress Down Days payments electronically.
- <u>Before and After Care Program:</u> If you are interested in having your child participate in the extended care program (Before Care, After Care and/or Clubs) registration is required. Click here for more information
- Chromebook Insurance: In order to receive a Chromebook, parents/guardians must first purchase insurance. The insurance fee is \$25 per Chromebook for the school year. This insurance will cover repairs for accidental damages but does not cover loss, theft or damage caused by abuse or neglect. We are strongly advising all families to purchase their insurance online through our website. Click here to make the payment and select "Chromebook Fee" for the purpose of payment. If purchasing insurance online is not possible, please stop by the main office (East or West Campus) during normal business hours to purchase the insurance in person. Payments and technology agreements will also be accepted at your students back to school events; however, they will not receive their device until the first day of school.

- Physicals: All 4th and 7th Grade students must have a physical turned into the nurse's office for the 2023-2024 school year. Please make their appointments if they do not already have one scheduled for 4th and 7th Grades. The nurse's office needs to be updated anytime your child has a change in health conditions or new vaccinations. Please continue to take your child for yearly check-ups with their pediatrician so the doctor may evaluate your child's growth and changing health needs.
- Health Conditions: If your child has a chronic health condition (asthma, anaphylaxis, seizure, cardiac, etc.), please turn in a required Emergency Action Plan signed by your pediatrician by the first day of school. Take this time before school starts to obtain new inhalers, EpiPens etc. so your child will have their medication in the nurse's office on the first day of school.

- 2023-2024 LAAA Sports Program (for grades 6-8 only): If your child is planning to participate in our school sports program, he/she must provide a physical to the school by August 1, 2023. This deadline applies to ALL student-athletes. The physical must be documented on an official DIAA Physical Form (DIAA PPE Form), which can be retrieved from the school's athletics website (www.aspiraacademysports.com).
- Car Arrival and Dismissal: Arrival procedures will remain the same as in previous years. Returning families will display in their rear view mirror the same CarRider Pro Tag(s) used in previous years. New families will receive two CarRider Pro tags by regular mail during Welcome Back to school events. There will be a charge of \$25 per replacement tag (returning families). The CarRider Pro Tags are read as your vehicle enters the school, which allows us to expedite the student car dismissal process. We will not be able to dismiss students in the order their vehicle came into the back parking lot if the parent/guardian does not have a CarRider Pro Tag. These students will be dismissed last.
- Volunteer Hours: As per our Code of Conduct, it is required that each family must complete a minimum of five (5) hours of volunteer time during each school year (July 1, 2023 June 30, 2024). Parents/Guardians and other community members who will be volunteering on school premises during school hours must present an official identification (ex. driver's license, state ID, passport, etc).
- The Family Resource Center (FRC): The Family Resource Center provides information about programs and services to support our families and strengthen our school community. In partnership with community-based organizations, planning is underway to continue providing Adult English Language Learner Classes and free Financial Coaching services onsite.
