In preparation for another great school year, we want to take this opportunity to provide you with some important information and updates.

• This school year, we will continue using "School Messenger" to communicate with families. Most of you have already received communications through the School Messenger system. This system will allow us to send communications via voice message, email and phone texts. To ensure that you receive school wide and classroom notifications, it is crucial that any changes to your primary phone number and email are communicated promptly to the school main office. - Contact Verification and School Forms: This year, during the Welcome Back to School Night on August 23rd (6pm) you will receive information and forms. The forms MUST be completed and RETURNED to the main office by the first day of school. The first day of school for 9th and 12th graders is August 28, 2023. The first day of school for 10th and 11th graders is August 29, 2023.
- <u>Transportation to/from school:</u> Please complete the transportation survey, click <u>HERE</u>. Please note, if you do not complete and submit the transportation survey by Tuesday, August 1, 2023, your child will be assigned as a car rider and no school bus option will be available to you.
- Students who plan to drive to school must apply for a parking pass. The application is available online click <a href="HERE">HERE</a>. The cost for a parking pass is \$30.00. Students who do not have a current parking pass will not be able to park in the school student parking lot.

Chromebook Insurance: In order to receive a Chromebook, parents/guardians must first purchase insurance. The insurance fee is \$25 per Chromebook for the school year. This insurance will cover repairs for accidental damages but does not cover loss, theft or damage caused by abuse or neglect. We are strongly advising all families to purchase their insurance online through our website. Click <a href="here">here</a> to make the payment and select "Chromebook Fee" for the purpose of payment. If purchasing insurance online is not possible, please stop by the main office (East or West Campus) during normal business hours to purchase the insurance in person. Payments and technology agreements will also be accepted at your students welcome back to school nights; however, they will not receive their device until the first day of school.

Students *will not* be permitted to use any personal devices while in the school. The Chromebooks that are provided to students have the necessary software for us to protect them while online, monitor their assessments, and provide students with the access to all online platforms used for instruction.

- <u>Student Schedules</u>: Schedules will be distributed at the Welcome Back to School Night on August 23rd beginning at 6:00pm. Students and families who are unable to attend will be able to view the student schedule on August 24th.

- <u>Dollar Dress Down Days:</u> We will have bi-weekly *Dollar Dress Down Days (DDD)* scheduled in our School Calendar throughout the 2023-2024 school year. Students will follow the DDD guidelines and expectations shared in the School Code of Conduct. Families can send cash payments with their students or use the electronic payment option on our school website. Selecting the electronic payment option will allow for daily, monthly, or annual payments based on your preference and convenience. - <u>School Supply List</u>: Students will receive school supply lists from their teachers on the first day of school. Supply lists are specific to the courses students are taking each semester. All classes require basic supplies such as pencils, pens, highlighters, colored pencils, notebooks, and folders.

- Physicals: All 9<sup>th</sup> Grade students must have a physical turned into the nurse's office for the 2023-2024 school year. Please make your child's appointment if they do not already have one scheduled for 9<sup>th</sup>. Grade. The nurse's office needs to be updated anytime your child has a change in health conditions or new vaccinations. Please continue to take your child for yearly check-ups with their pediatrician so the doctor may evaluate your child's growth and changing health needs.
- Health Conditions: If your child has a chronic health condition (asthma, anaphylaxis, seizure, cardiac, etc.), please turn in a required Emergency Action Plan signed by your pediatrician by the first day of school. Take this time before school starts to obtain new inhalers, EpiPens etc. so your child will have their medication in the nurse's office on the first day of school.
- 2023-2024 LAAA Sports Program (for high school students): We are happy to announce that we will be
  conducting the following high school sports this fall: girls volleyball, boys soccer, boys and girls cross
  country, and girls field hockey. If your child plans to try out for one of these teams, families are strongly
  encouraged to attend a fall sports meeting.

- <u>Car Arrival and Dismissal:</u> We will have a new traffic pattern for car riders this year. We can no longer make a right directly off the main entrance. Please follow the signs and cones in the parking lot to assist us in a safe and smooth arrival and dismissal for our students.
