#### Communication:

We will continue using **SchoolMessenger** for all school-wide communications. This system allows us to send communications via voicemail, email, and phone text. To receive school-wide and classroom notifications, promptly inform the school's main office of any changes to your primary phone number or email address. Please opt-in to receive these important messages or download the SchoolMessenger app (see the Communication section below for instructions).

 <u>SchoolMessenger</u>: School-wide communications will be sent via SchoolMessenger. These messages are sent by email, text, and voicemail when necessary. To opt in to receive these important messages and/or download the app for easy access, click <u>HERE</u> for instructions.  <u>Contact Verification</u>: You will receive the contact verification form during the August *Welcome Back to School* events. This form MUST be completed and returned to the main office on the same day or by the first day of school, August 26, 2024.

## Transportation to/from school:

If you have not completed and submitted the transportation survey that was sent to you the first week of July, click <u>HERE</u> to complete it. Please note that if you do not complete and submit the transportation survey by Tuesday, July 23, 2024, your child will be considered a "car rider" with **no** bus route assignment.

<u>Car Arrival and Dismissal</u>: Please follow the signage, cones, and directions provided by our team for a safe and smooth arrival process.

<u>Student Drivers</u>: Students who plan to drive to and from school are required to register their vehicle with the school. Students may now apply for their parking pass using <u>this link</u>. Approved passes will be distributed at the Back to School Night event.

#### Nutrition:

- Breakfast will be available to all students from 6:50am 7:05am. The only exception to this procedure would be to accommodate late bus arrivals.
- We will continue offering healthy meals to our students. LAAA students receive free breakfast and lunch all year long.

# School Policies:

- Uniform Policy:
  - There are no changes to the uniform policy. Students are expected to be in uniform daily with the exception Dollar Dress Down Days. Students who choose not to participate in Dollar Dress Down Day are expected to be in uniform. Click <u>HERE</u> to review the Uniform Policy.
  - Dollar Dress Down Days: We will have bi-weekly Dollar Dress Down Days (DDD) scheduled in our School Calendar throughout the 2024-2025 school year. Students will follow the DDD guidelines and expectations shared in the School Code of Conduct. DDD earnings are designated to

enhance and support academic, extracurricular, and other studentrelated activities. There are two options to pay for Dress Down Days.

- Option 1: Use the electronic payment option on our school website. This option will allow for annual payments only (a total of \$16.00). These payments must be received by August 29, 2024. Click <u>HERE</u> to make the annual Dress Down Days payment of \$16.00 electronically:
- Option 2: Families can send cash payments (\$1) with their student(s) on each Dress Down Day. Please send exact change only.

#### • Homework Policy:

At ASPIRA Charter High School, we believe that homework enhances and extends the learning that occurs in the classroom and helps to develop students as independent learners. The purpose of homework is to provide feedback to the student and teacher how learning is progressing. Therefore, teachers will assign quality homework tasks that are essential to student learning. The task may be for pre-learning, checking for understanding, practice, and/or processing. Students have a responsibility to:

- Spend approximately 30 minutes of focused, non-distracted effort on homework per class meeting (AP/Dual enrollment classes will require more time) and turn homework in on the date due.
- Engage in self-assessment, identify areas for improvement, and take the initiative to address areas of difficulty
- $\circ$   $\;$  Clarify with the teacher any instructions or content not understood.
- Keep an up-to-date agenda for homework and other assignment and their due dates.
- Arrange an appropriate study area that is free from distraction.

#### • Cell Phone Policy:

ASPIRA Charter High School will be updating its cell phone policy to reflect the needs of the school and the changes adopted in other high schools across the state and country. An additional communication regarding cell phones in school will be sent at a later time.

## School Equipment & Supply Lists:

- Chromebook Insurance: In order to receive a Chromebook, parents/guardians must first purchase insurance for \$27 dollars. This insurance will cover repairs for accidental damages. It <u>does not</u> cover loss, theft, or damage caused by abuse or neglect. You will receive an email on Friday, July 26, 2024 to purchase it online, along with the technology agreements, through our processing site "Permission Click". If purchasing insurance online is not possible, please stop by the main office (East or West Campus) during normal business hours to purchase the insurance in person. Payments and technology agreements will also be accepted at your student's back to school events; however, students will not receive their device until <u>after</u> the first day of school for payments made after Friday, August 9th.
- <u>School Supply List</u>: The school supply lists for all grades are located on the school website.

## **School Nurse/Medical Information:**

- Physicals: All 9<sup>th</sup> grade and students new to ASPIRA Charter High School must have a physical turned into the nurse's office for the 2024-2025 school year. Please make their appointments if they do not already have one scheduled. The nurse's office needs to be updated anytime your child has a change in health conditions or new vaccinations. Please continue to take your child for yearly check-ups with their pediatrician so the doctor may evaluate your child's growth and changing health needs.
- Health Conditions: If your child has a chronic health condition (asthma, anaphylaxis, seizure, cardiac, etc.), please turn in a required Emergency Action Plan signed by your pediatrician by the first day of school. Take this time before school starts to obtain new inhalers, EpiPens etc., so your child will have their medication in the nurse's office on the first day of school.

# Sports/Athletics Program:

- 2024-2025 LAAA Sports Program: All incoming 9<sup>th</sup> 12<sup>th</sup> grade students interested in playing a sport must have a DIAA physical form completed, signed by a physician, and turned into the nurses' office for the 2024-2025 school year. This form must be turned in before the start of each sports season to ensure eligibility for try-outs. The physical must be documented on an official DIAA Physical Form (DIAA PPE Form), which can be retrieved from the school's athletics website (<u>https://www.aspirawolves.com/</u>).
  - All Students Must Have A Sports Physical In Order to Try-Out (No Exceptions)
    Fall Physical's due date August 9th
  - Sports Try-Outs Schedule:
    - Fall Begins August 12 (see the website for specific dates for each sport)
  - DIAA Eligibility for Sports:
    - Passing Work: Students must pass three of their four classes, with two of the passing courses in the areas of English, Mathematics, Science, or Social Studies. Eligibility for each season will be contingent upon the previous semester's grades. The final grades for the previous school year shall determine eligibility for the first semester of the following school year.
    - Attendance: Students must be present during the school day to be eligible to participate in games or practice for that day. Three (3) or more unexcused absences from practice will result in removal from the team.
    - Discipline: Students who receive (3) or more disciplinary referrals shall meet with the review board to determine eligibility with a possibility of removal from the team.
    - Fee: There is a \$50 student athletics fee for each sport a student plays.

## **Parent/Guardian/Families**

- Volunteer Hours: As per our Code of Conduct, each family must complete a minimum of five (5) hours of volunteer time during each school year (July 1, 2024 June 30, 2025). Parents/Guardians and other community members who will be volunteering on school premises during school hours must present an official identification (ex., driver's license, state ID, passport, etc). Parents must download the MobileServe app to find volunteering opportunities and to record volunteer hours. Please click <u>HERE</u> to obtain more information.
- The Family Resource Center (FRC): The Family Resource Center provides information about programs and services to support our families and strengthen our school community. In partnership with community-based organizations, planning is underway to continue providing Adult English Language Learner Classes and free Financial Coaching services onsite.
